** "Fines" or "Happy Dollars" vary from Quarter to Quarter	\$
Quarterly Paul Harris Donation (Optional)	\$25

A typical billing for <u>one quarter</u> for each member would be as listed below:

Quarterly District/International Dues	\$ 30.00
Lunches at \$15 per Meeting (12 per Quarter)	180.00
Typical Fines or Happy Dollars (These may be waived, if desired)	25.00
Quarterly Paul Harris Donation (optional)	25.00
TOTAL	\$ 260.00

**Rotary "fines" are assessed by the Sergeant at Arms at Rotary Club meetings as a fun way of collecting additional money for Club projects. A Rotarian may give "Happy Dollars" for some event, e.g. birth of a child or grandchild, new car, new job, trip, etc. or be "fined" for not wearing the Rotary pin, etc. These amounts are noted at the meeting and then included in the quarterly statement.
